

There have been previous discussions and massive objections regarding runway 05 departures when it was it proposed that early turning resulting in low level flying over a densely populated area with both public halls and pre-school, primary and secondary schools should take place (GALGA and FLEMN)

At the meeting on 3rd Oct 2019 the issue of low level turning appears to have been included in what is now point 7 in the refined list of design principles (final) v1.0 dated 09/10/2019. It is however such an important point that I suggest that - low level turning on departures which necessitate the overflying of areas as described in the previous paragraph - cannot be part of the Glasgow Airspace Proposal and should be declared as such in the final (refined) list of airspace design principles.







We note with interest the developments at Glasgow and further note the CAA's intent to reduce the size of controlled airspace in general.
When, an ANSP is granted approval, that Provider is required to provide a service for all traffic following a request.

During the previous GLA airspace change, when the airspace above our area was reduced from 6000' to 3000' and reclassified as 'D', we were assured that no zone transits would be denied.

Unfortunately transits have been denied or in some cases when asked to 'Stand by' it is not feasible to wait for an unknown period for a transit, thus pilots route around the zone. We have also had an increase in noise complaints.

Since the withdrawal of RW 27/09 at Glasgow Airport, there is no longer a requirement for SRA to those runways so the Western and Eastern extent of the present CTR can be reduced, thus allowing VFR traffic to transit without the need for a clearance from GLA ATC, For Example a direct track from Prestwick to Cumbernauld could be made, avoiding built up areas and alleviating the choke point at Glenmavis GVS.

By having a staged approach path, outside 10NM, this would allow for the use of the "Right Hand Traffic" rule which would allow pilots further safety, along Carron Valley reservoir to/from Cumbernauld and avoiding airspace infringements.

Further, there is no reason for the zone to be at SFC in the Balfron area as it is not possible to make contact with GLA ATC below 1500' or thereabouts.

Taking the foregoing into account, I suggest that GLA airspace is changed to SFC 3000' from Aerodrome reference point out to 10nm, 8NM wide and is limited as shown in my attachment with 4000 to 6000' between 10 and 15nm on the extended RW C/L.

If required, GLA airspace could be extended horizontally, from that which I have shown, above 4000' AMSL for IFR traffic, thus allowing VFR traffic underneath which would be a much less restrictive area than currently exists and reducing ATC workload. Please let me know if you require any clarification or have any questions relating to my submission. I look forward to hearing from you.





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

Lower levels of controlled airspace surrounding the Glasgow CTR should be removed from control.

This will enlarge Glasgow Local Flying Areas to the south, the west and north east to benefit GA. RT reception in parts of these areas has traditionally been poor re. high ground towards Glasgow Airport. RT reception for GA operating at higher levels than present in these areas will improve safety. Arriving and departing commercial traffic here will normally be at a higher level and will not be restricted.

Reopen the second runway at Glasgow Airport for GA daytime use.

Possibly, with a displaced threshold at the south east end.

There is no need for lighting it to be installed.

Is there a need for this runway to be "licenced" with the associated expense?

This will separate GA from commercial traffic reducing delay for both and improving separation and safety.

Stakeholders may not fully appreciate the issues adversely affecting GA.

Over its, now 57 years, of operation a significant number of Glasgow Flying Club pilot members have continued training to obtain commercial licences.

This confirms the value of, and industry respect for, the high GA training standards achievable within a commercial airport environment.

The contribution this Glasgow Airport GA training facility makes to aviation must not be lost by unnecessary airspace and runway restrictions.

Although GA has minor financial effect, Glasgow Airport should encourage local pilot training to ensure continuity of its historic industry contribution.

Stakeholders could benefit from experiencing GA flying for themselves which is markedly different from flying as a commercial aircraft passenger.




Thank you for your invitation. September is a very busy month for in which this unfortunately will not fit. I do have some general ideas what we would want for efficiency of the airspace:

Arrival:

Funneling all arrivals through LANAK adds some NM to the arrivals which could be prevented by designing a PBN based arrival to the ILS approaches.

Departure:

We are planning (blue) the NORBO 1H departure but get a clearance for the PROP version (Purple):



The shortcut is great but for planning we have to account for the longer procedure, adding fuel transport loss and time.

As for PBN; RNP AR arrivals for tight procedures to avoid noise sensitive area's is something we do not prefer due to the high training and maintenance cost for the operators. A good example of PBN combined with conventional procedures to take maximum benefit is EDDF ILS X 07R.

Hope these are some suggestions you can work with. Please feel free If you have any further questions or proposals to discuss.

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



Thank you for your feedback form regarding Glasgow Airport's ACP. In response to your points within your feedback form we will look to answer you queries in turn. For those items specifically relating to design principles, these have now been considered and recorded in our final design principles list that will now be submitted to the CAA.

You asked for confirmation that guidance regarding flight over terrain would be adhered to. We can confirm that our appraisal of options will take account of both terrain height and aircraft flight altitude in line with DfT Air Navigation Guidance 2017, CAP1616, The Environmental Noise (Scotland) Regulations 2006, Section 70 of the Transport Act, the Airspace Modernisation Strategy and all applicable EU legislation. These regulations take account of noise impacts and avoidance of overflight of AONBs, where practicable.

You asked for confirmation of the altitude at which aircraft currently exit our airspace. Unfortunately, there is no definitive answer to this. Aircraft climb at different rates depending on their performance and other traffic implications so this can vary significantly. We are currently unable to provide detail on any future impacts as we have no airspace design options which to assess. The first assessment of potential environmental impacts, including noise and heights of aircraft in any location, will not take place until Stage 2B (Initial Options Appraisal) of the CAP1616 process. You also asked us to confirm the current permitted level of departures authorised to use the airspace above Uplawmoor. I can confirm that there is no restriction on volume of aircraft flying in any areas of our airspace. We would be happy to provide an opportunity to discuss these points in more detail at the airport where we can answer any questions you might have on our current operations in order to provide a more transparent overview of how aircraft operate at present.

You asked that we consider early morning, specifically before 0700 as part of the "anti-social" hours described. To offer some reassurance, CAP 1616 and DfT Air Navigation Guidance 2017 state that "For the purpose of noise metrics, daytime will be the 16 hour period from 0700 to 2300 and night time will be the period from 2300 to 0700". I hope that this provides some clarity on the definitions that we will be working to.

We note that you suggest that any proposals "must" avoid overflight of areas that are currently not affected by aircraft noise. We should point out that this is not a requirement of any process, legislation or guidance material associated with airspace change. However, we have recognised the request from some stakeholders for this and our current proposed draft design principle 7 " The arrival and departure routes that serve Glasgow Airport below 7000ft should avoid noise sensitive areas, buildings, national **serve** of outstanding natural beauty and areas that are not currently affected by aircraft noise" addresses this particular feedback..


Current situation

- GAL handled 9.7m passengers in 2018, travelling with 30 airlines to 120 destinations, including major hubs like London Heathrow, Amsterdam, Dubai, Frankfurt, Munich and Dublin.
- The airport also handles 16,000 tons of freight per year (a 4-fold increase in the past decade), supported by 57 logistics carriers.
- The activities and connectivity provided by GAL is estimated to support 30,000 jobs and contribute £1.4bn to the Scottish GDP.
- The airport is one of fastest growing in Europe. Forecasts indicate the GLA will grow to serve 17m passengers by 2040.
- A £1bn long-term development strategy has recently been prepared to enable the forecast growth at the airport.

- During week 12 of the 13-week consultation the DfT requested we restart the process under new legislation CAP 1616.
- The CAA stated the decision did "not reflect any judgement about the quality of the airport's consultation to date."





## **UK STRATEGY FOR AIRSPACE MODERNISATION**

# Airspace modernisation is a UK Government policy objective



Glasgow Airport is required to meet EASA legislation on Performance Based Navigation by 2024 (EU 2018/1048). Department for Transport

The Aviation Strategy sets out UK's overall objectives for airspace modernisation to deliver: quicker, quieter and cleaner journeys and more capacity for the benefit of those who use and are affected by UK airspace.



Main aim of the Airspace Modernisation Strategy (AMS) is to modernise the airspace structure and route network to add the capacity to accommodate forecast growth in demand for aviation in a sustainable way. In Scotland this is coordinated via the FASI North group.



## **BACKGROUND: OBJECTIVES OF AIRSPACE MODERNISATION**

The UK Government and its independent aviation regulator (the Civil Aviation Authority) require the UK's airspace to be modernised (redesigned and upgraded) to achieve the following objectives set out in the Airspace Modernisation Strategy.

- 1. Enable continuous improvements in safety standards.
- 2. Accommodate growing demand from airspace user groups, including commercial air transport that is key to the UK's transport infrastructure and economy and the Military to meet defense and security requirements.
- 3. Enable government policies to reduce and mitigate of the impact of aircraft noise on local communities.
- 4. Deal with 'hotspots' of congestion within the current system.
- 5. Further enable greater access to airspace for non-commercial users.
- 6. Improve the resilience of the airspace bad weather or other forms of disruption
- 7. Encourage the adoption of new technologies that can improve the safety and efficiency of air transport, including advancements in communications, navigation and surveillance and the integration of space flights and drones.



To deliver these objectives the Government and CAA are co-sponsoring the implementation of the Airspace Modernisation Strategy (known as the AMS or CAP1711), which requires the aviation industry to make a series of investments and deliver a wide-reaching programme of airspace changes.

Most of the AMS requirements fall to:

- **Airports:** to make airspace changes at lower altitudes (below 7000ft) that upgrade their arrival and departure routes.
- The UK's Enroute Air Navigation Service Provider (NATS): to make airspace changes to the airways network (above 7000ft) and invest in new systems and tools for air traffic control.
- **Airspace users:** to invest in new avionics and improve their approach to flight planning.



Many of the airspace changes that the airports and NATS are required to deliver overlap. In the busiest areas of Southern England, Northern England and Scotland the airspace changes have been grouped into two major programmes:

- Future Airspace Implementation (FASI) North The fundamental redesign of the terminal airspace in northern England and Scotland that is based on the widespread adoption of satellite navigation procedures.
- Future Airspace Implementation (FASI) South The fundamental redesign of the terminal airspace in Southern England.

The FASI North and South airports are responsible for upgrading their individual arrival and departure routes from the ground to 7000ft.

NATS are responsible for redesigning the route network above 7000ft. that guides traffic to and from the boundaries of the UK's airspace.

The airports and NATS are working closely to ensure that their individual ACPs are aligned and the final set of changes can be combined seamlessly.



An airspace change proposal (ACP) is needed at Glasgow Airport to upgrade the airport's arrival and departure routes in line with the requirements of the AMS (and specifically the FASI North initiative).

# The ACP offers the oppourtunity to:

- Enhance safety: By reducing/removing safety risk factors from the current operation.
- Better manage the impact of aircraft noise: By deploying more precise and flexible routes that optimise aircraft performance, avoid noise sensitive areas and offer predictable relief.
- **Increase flight efficiency:** By tackling the inefficiencies in the current route structure that lead to aircraft flying longer tracks and sub-optimal climb and descent profiles.
- **Improve network performance:** By integrating GLA's routes with those of adjacent airports and the wider terminal airspace network in Scotland and Northern England.
- Further enable greater access to airspace for non-commercial users: By introducing means to encourage airspace integration (rather than segregation).
- **Strengthen resilience:** By introducing additional airspace capacity for redundancy in the event of disruption.
- **Optimise the performance of existing infrastructure** by configuring the airspace to deliver the most efficient use of existing runway capacity.



## THE REGULATORY AIRSPACE CHANGE PROCESS


Every ACP sponsor must follow the regulatory process for changing the airspace design, including community engagement requirements - known as CAP1616 (Civil Aviation Publication no. 1616).

- CAP1616 sets out the process for developing airspace change options. This entails engaging with affected stakeholders, evaluating the impacts of options, consulting with the public, regulatory assessment and implementation.
- The outputs of each stage are reviewed by the CAA to ensure the engagement and analysis is robust prior to moving to the next stage.

# **OVERALL ACP TIMELINE**





Our ACP is currently in Stage 1 of the CAP1616 process – known as the **Define Stage**.

As a first step (1a), we have prepared a Statement of Need that sets out the issues that our ACP is seeking to address and we have met with the CAA to discuss how we will progress through the process.

The second step of Stage 1 (1b) is to draw up design principles that we will use later in the process, to guide how airspace change options are developed and evaluated.

Our design principles will be drawn up through discussions with a mix of stakeholders that are potentially affected by the airspace change. The design principles aim to capture all important considerations that should be factored in when developing airspace design options.

Some principles will be based on fundamentals like safety, operational and environmental performance; others may be specific to local circumstances.



For the Stage 1 gateway meeting we are required to submit a set of proposed design principles to the CAA with an explanation of how these were developed and influenced through our engagement with stakeholders. We are following a four-step approach:

**1. Gather inputs** from stakeholders about the potential impacts of our airspace change, through targeted two-way conversations around six themes.

2. Develop an initial set of design principles based on the feedback gathered during step 1 and share them with stakeholders for their consideration. **3. Refine the design principles** through a second round of targeted engagement, consider the prioritisation of the principles and any stakeholder objections.

4. Submit our proposed set of design principles to the CAA, along with an explanation of how they were created and influenced through the engagement with stakeholders.



# THEMES TO GATHER STAKEHOLDER INPUTS

There are several themes associated with the drivers for, and impacts of, an airspace change that may be considered when developing design principles. These include:

- 1. Safety (overriding priority)
- 2. Capacity
- 3. Noise
- 4. Airspace access and integration
- 5. Flight efficiency
- 6. Use of advanced navigation technology



# **1. SAFETY**

Aviation safety is considered the first and overriding priority for a framework intended to guide the development of airspace design options.

- Airspace change is an opportunity to enhance safety performance by reducing, and even removing, risk factors from the operation.
- As traffic levels grow and the airspace accommodates a larger number of flights, continuous enhancements in safety are considered necessary to maintain the established level of safety performance per flight.
- Airspace modernisation often involves the deployment of new concepts and technologies that could introduce new safety risks. These must each be assured independently and collectively as part of an overall 'system approach' to aviation safety.

Discuss: The principle(s) related to aviation safety that are particularly important when developing airspace design options.



# 2. CAPACITY

A main driver for most ACPs progressed by the commercial air transport sector is the introduction of additional airspace capacity to support existing flights without generating delays and accommodate the forecast increase in traffic levels over time.

- The capacity of our airspace depends on the ability of air traffic controllers to secure the expeditious flow of traffic through designated sectors. Capacity is restricted when the volume of traffic through a given sector is predicted to exceed a level that controllers can manage safely.
- For additional airspace capacity in the vicinity of the airport to accommodate flights without delays it must be integrated effectively with the wider terminal airspace network, the capacity of the runway and the capacity used by neighboring airports.
- The potential capacity of the airspace to accommodate a given number of flights can only be achieved if the key capabilities required to support the operation (e.g. resources, procedures and technology) are in place.

Discuss: The principle(s) related to airspace capacity that are particularly important when developing airspace design options.



# 3. NOISE

Airspace design options should seek to minimise the total adverse effects of aircraft noise at lower altitudes.

- Airspace design options should conform as far as possible to the existing arrival and departure swathes to limit the number of new flights over people that were previously unaffected by aircraft noise.
- The airspace design options should consider multiple routes that can be switched on and off to reduce the impact of noise. The use of multiple routes may increase the total number of people affected by noise, including people that were previously unaffected.
- Other methods to manage the impact of noise, like alternating the way that inbound and outbound traffic is sequenced, could also be included in the airspace design options where operationally feasible.

Discuss: The principle(s) related to noise that are particularly important when developing airspace design options.



# 4. AIRSPACE ACCESS AND INTEGRATION

The AMS promotes the concept of airspace integration, rather than segregation, to meet the demands of all airspace users in a safe and efficient way.

- The airport's airspace design will be developed and deployed in the same timeframe as the other FASI North airports upgrade their own arrival and departure routes.
- NATS are developing plans to upgrade the terminal airspace in northern England and Scotland to accommodate the forecast traffic growth (as part of FASI North). The airport's airspace design should integrate seamlessly with the wider network and not constrain the other airport's plans.
- In addition, the airspace structures deployed to support air transport operations at GAL should not place disproportionate limitations on other airspace users' access to the airspace.

Discuss: The principle(s) related to airspace access and integration that are particularly important when developing airspace design options.



# **5. FLIGHT EFFICIENCY**

Where introducing the capacity to enable growth is often a main driver of an airspace change. Ensuring any growth is sustainable is an essential requirement as set out in government policy.

- Flight efficiency improvements could be enabled by the airspace change through more continuous climb and descent profiles and shorter track miles.
- Steeper climbs and approaches and shorter routes are usually more fuel efficient for aircraft to fly and generate fewer emissions.
- Airspace design options should also consider the impact of routes on local air quality.

Discuss: The principle(s) related to flight efficiency that are particularly important when developing airspace design options.



## 6. USE OF ADVANCED NAVIGATION TECHNOLOGY

The ground-based NAVAIDs that the airport's existing routes rely on are being removed because they are old and outdated. All new routes should be designed to an advanced satellite navigation standard that aircraft can fly to high levels of track keeping accuracy and with minimal intervention from air traffic controllers.

- With new navigation technology there should be less need for air traffic controllers to regularly vector aircraft away from their designated route (generating greater predictability that underpins better noise management).
- The use of advanced navigation standards enable routes to be designed with the precision and flexibility to avoid more noise sensitive areas and buildings. But advanced navigation also creates the potential to concentrate traffic swathes.
- For some departure routes, there may be a trade-off between climbing quickly and making early turns to avoid noise sensitive areas and buildings.

Discuss: The principle(s) related to advanced navigation technology that are particularly important when developing airspace design options.

- 19. All materials presented to stakeholders to support the development of airspace design options should be simple, accessible and jargon and acronyms should be kept a minimum.



3. Summary of feedback provided remotely and proposed updates

We have received 25 responses to our request for feedback on the initial list of potential design principles from a mix of stakeholders, including:

- Nine local government and local community responses
- Six commercial air transport responses (including airlines, airports & freight)
- Four general aviation responses
- Three responses from environmental groups
- One response from the military (MoD)
- One response from a Member of Parliament (the office of Jo Swinson)



## Summary of feedback

- Local community feedback focused on minimising noise impacts.
- General aviation and Military users focused on the preservation of uncontrolled airspace and access to controlled airspace.
- Commercial air transport feedback focused on promoting airspace modernisation, operational efficiency and ensuring the proposals align with standard procedures.
- There is a high level of support for engagement process to date. Feedback forms indicate the initial list of design principles is a fair reflection of the first round of engagement.



# Summary of feedback

- Air pollution, the broader health impacts of overflight and land-use planning were not specifically incorporated as design principles.
- Some issues raised will require compromises and trade-offs between the different potential benefits of the airspace change.
- Some issues raised are not within the scope of an airspace change to resolve.
- Future engagement and consultation material should be as simple and accessible as possible.



4. Review and refinement of potential design principles by theme

For the design principles covered in each theme please consider:

- Where you suggest we should add to or amend the existing principles.
- What additional principles you suggest we should cover under the theme.

## **Airspace Design Principles Engagement**

Summary of feedback and potential design principles drawn from the first round of engagement workshops

Version 1.4, September 16<sup>th</sup> 2019 Reference: ACP 2019-46

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## 1. Introduction

This document summarises the feedback gathered from the first round of engagement workshops conducted by Glasgow Airport Limited (GAL) to develop design principles for our new airspace change proposal (ACP 2019-46). Three workshops were conducted in the first round of engagement with aviation organisations, local government and business representatives and local community and interest groups. The workshops took place on September 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> 2019 at the Corinthian Club in Glasgow. A full list of the workshop participants is set out in Appendix A. The objectives of the workshops in the first round of engagement were to:

- Increase the awareness and understanding among stakeholders about the need for airspace change and the process for bringing it about.
- Gain an understanding of what stakeholders believe are the main issues and opportunities connected with the use of airspace and any proposed changes.
- Gather insights from the stakeholders about the factors that should be considered when developing the airspace design principles.
- Establish a forum that can meet again in future stages of the airspace change process to compare and contrast potential airspace design options.

During the workshops, participants were given a presentation outlining the drivers for changing our airspace that are set out in the UK Airspace Modernisation Strategy (AMS) and an overview the regulatory process that all airspace change sponsors must follow.<sup>1</sup> Stakeholders were then presented with several themes related to airspace change to discuss in sub-groups. The aim of the sub-group discussions were to gather stakeholders' views about the main airspace design considerations associated with each theme, and to use that information in plenary to have conversations about the factors that are important for us to consider when developing an initial list of potential design principles. The themes for discussion were:

- Safety
- Capacity
- Noise
- Airspace Access and Integration
- Flight Efficiency
- Use of Advanced Navigation Technology
- Other themes raised by stakeholders that are not adequately covered above

Section two of this document summarises the feedback gathered from the discussions about each theme and proposes an initial list of potential design principle statements that will be either be discounted or refined in the second round of engagement with stakeholders. Section three explains how stakeholders can provide additional feedback and comments on the potential design principles using the feedback form that accompanies this document. All stakeholders invited to the first round of engagement will be invited to attend one of two further workshops in the second round of engagement, scheduled for October 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> at the Corinthian Club.

## 2. Summary of feedback and potential design principles

Tables 1 to 7 summarise the feedback gathered from the discussions about each theme in the first round of engagement workshops. Similar points of feedback about each theme are grouped together. The initial list of potential design principles to either discount or further refine in discussion with stakeholders during the second round of engagement are set out in table 8.

## Table 1: Feedback linked to safety

Feedback	
1.1. Maintaining and enhancing aviation safety is the top priority and should be the overriding consideration when developing airspace design options for the new ACP.	
1.2. New technologies and operating approaches should be considered that have the potential to enhance safety.	
1.3. Risks to aviation safety should continue to be as low as reasonably practical following the airspace change.	
1.4. There is a recognition from stakeholders that the airspace surrounding Glasgow airport has	

- an excellent safety performance record and that airspace design options should not result in a degradation in that performance for any airspace user group.
- 1.5. Airspace design options with the potential to lower the actual height of aircraft above the ground (altitude above terrain rather than altitude above mean sea level) should be carefully considered from a safety assurance perspective.

## Table 2: Feedback linked to capacity

### Feedback

- 2.1. Additional capacity is required to ensure greater global connectivity for Scotland by enabling more direct routes to more destinations.
- 2.2. The capacity required to accommodate freight that is transported by air now and in the future should be considered when developing airspace design options.
- 2.3. Additional capacity should be used to mitigate any future requirement for airborne holding of aircraft inbound to Glasgow airport.
- 2.4. The physical and mental health and wellbeing of local communities is an important consideration when assessing the impacts of introducing additional airspace capacity in the Glasgow region.
- 2.5. Any impact on the workload of employees brought about by increase in airspace capacity should be carefully considered by employers, although stakeholders recognised that this is not within the scope of the ACP.
- 2.6. Additional airspace capacity to accommodate the continued growth in demand for aviation does not seem compatible with the Scottish Government's recent response to the Global Climate Emergency.
- 2.7. Additional airspace capacity should be used to facilitate a reduction in aircraft emissions for traffic operating into and out of Glasgow Airport.

- 2.8. Additional airspace capacity should facilitate a reduction in the intensity of operations during more anti-social hours (e.g. the evening and night-time period), although stakeholders recognised that this is not within the scope of the ACP.
- 2.9. The controlled airspace needed to support additional capacity should be the minimum volume required to accommodate the forecast growth in demand for commercial air transport so that the impacts on other airspace users are manageable.
- 2.10. Flexible use airspace concepts and procedures should be considered to optimise the benefits of additional airspace capacity for all users.

## Table 3: Feedback linked to noise

### Feedback

- 3.1. The noise impacts generated by the airspace design options should be compared consistently against a credible 2019 baseline as part of the ACP process.
- 3.2. The ACP process should identify noise sensitive areas and buildings and ensure the airspace design options prioritise their avoidance, including areas that are not currently overflown.
- 3.3. Assessments of the total adverse impacts of noise generated by different airspace design options should consider the broader effects on health and wellbeing caused by greater overflight of already underprivileged areas.
- 3.4. The airport should consider incentive mechanisms to encourage operators to adopt quieter aircraft (e.g. scaling runway charges based on noise and offering quieter aircraft more efficient routes), although stakeholders recognised that this is outside the scope of the ACP.
- 3.5. The airspace design options should enable commercial air transport operators to fly higher sooner on departure and stay higher for longer on arrival, thereby reducing noise impacts. Continuous climb and descent operations should be designed to / from a minimum of 7,000ft.
- 3.6. The improved climb and descent profiles should result in the base of controlled airspace being raised, allowing general aviation users to operate at higher altitudes underneath, thereby reducing noise impacts.
- 3.7. The airspace design options should consider ways to mitigate the effects of concentrating noise impacts around the centreline of a procedure because aircraft fly new performance-based navigation routes with greater precision.
- 3.8. Light pollution and vibrations are also considered to be external negative impacts of overflight at lower altitudes and should be incorporated into the impact assessment of different airspace design options along-side noise.
- 3.9. The airspace design options should include measures to offer local communities with predictable relief/respite from aircraft noise.
- 3.10.Noise respite measures that rely on the use of multiple route options, which are mutually exclusive and deployed at different times should be considered along-side the additional complexity that such arrangements may introduce into the operation.

- 3.11.Noise respite arrangements should be predictable and transparent for communities, airspace users and air traffic control so as to not create undue complexity.
- 3.12. Flexible use airspace structures and procedures should be considered as a potential means to better manage the impact of aircraft noise.
- 3.13. The airspace design options should incorporate the impact of overflying high terrain, where aircraft at the same altitude above mean sea level are closer to those on the ground.
- 3.14. There is an expectation that the intensity of aircraft noise events should reduce overtime due to the introduction of progressively quieter aircraft. The industry should continue to apply pressure on operators and manufacturers to encourage the development and adoption of quieter aircraft, although stakeholders recognised that this is outside the scope of the ACP.
- 3.15. Airspace design options should focus on the provision of predictable relief/respite from aircraft noise that reduces the frequency of noise events experienced by communities.

## Table 4: Feedback linked to airspace access and integration

#### Feedback

- 4.1. Airspace access and integration should be underpinned by transparency of all airspace users operating in the wider area, perhaps through means of electronic surveillance, although stakeholders recognised that this is outside the scope of the ACP.
- 4.2. Measures to enable airspace access and integration should be demonstrably as safe or safer than the current operation.
- 4.3. Measures to enable airspace access and integration should not be deployed at the expense of mitigations for the noise and emissions created by airspace users.
- 4.4. The airspace design options should be developed in close alignment with developments at adjacent airports and the en-route network.
- 4.5. Airspace design options should consider the mechanisms to protect commercial air transport operations in controlled airspace from drone activity.
- 4.6. There should be robust mechanisms established and overseen by the government or regulator that ensure the private owners of neighbouring airports work collaboratively for the overall good of the air transport network, passengers and communities.
- 4.7. The airspace design options should enable access to the airspace for Military operations and the Emergency Services.
- 4.8. The boundaries of controlled airspace should be simplified to mitigate against the risk of infringements and enable access for airspace users operating in uncontrolled airspace nearby.
- 4.9. Use of VFR crossing corridors should be considered as part of the airspace design options.
- 4.10.Some local community and business stakeholders expressed the view that the airspace should continue to be segregated and prioritised for commercial air transport operations, because the Scottish terminal airspace and airways network is a key part of the UK's transport infrastructure that supports travel, business, tourism and the wider economy.

- 4.11. The redesign of Glasgow Airports arrival and departure routes below 7,000ft should not be constrained by the NATS-led development of the terminal and airways network above 7,000ft.
- 4.12. Airspace design options should be cognisant of the impacts on the operations at nearby general aviation aerodromes.
- 4.13.General aviation operations should be considered as part of a holistic system of airspace usage that enable equitable access based on reasonable demand.

## Table 5: Feedback linked to flight efficiency

Feedback
5.1. The airspace design options should be compared consistently against a credible baseline of the emissions generated by the current operation in 2019.
5.2. A credible baseline for the air quality impacts created by the current operation is needed in order to compare different airspace design options consistently and transparently.
5.3. The airspace design options should prioritise the deployment of shorter routes and more efficient climb and descent profiles where possible, consistent with the requirements to better management aircraft noise at lower altitudes.
5.4. There will be difficult trade-off decisions between minimising the impact of noise and minimising aircraft emissions. Government policy and the regulatory process offer some guidance, but decisions should be made with the input of local community stakeholders and environmental interest groups.
5.5. The airspace design options should enable queueing and airborne holding to be reduced by supporting new concepts like more accurate target times of arrival.
5.6. The airspace design options should consider the broader impacts on the ecology of the region and the effects on non-human life.
5.7. Flexible Use Airspace principles should be considered to optimise the efficiency of the airspace, for example some volumes of airspace could be released for other airspace users depending on whether the airport is operating on easterlies or westerlies.
5.8. A holistic assessment of the impact of emissions generated by surface transport to and from the Airport should be conducted as part of the overall development of the Airport, of which this airspace is a part.
5.9. If Scotland's terminal airspace and wider airways structure in the enroute network is outdated it should be upgraded as a priority.
5.10.A representative from the Unite Union raised an objection to the concept of deploying alternative airspace structures that are intended to deliberately mitigate the impacts on

flight efficiency of legitimate industrial actions by air traffic controllers.

# **Airspace Design Principles Engagement**

Summary of feedback and refined design principles generated from the second round of engagement workshops

Version 1.0, October 9<sup>th</sup> 2019 Reference: ACP 2019-46

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# 1. Introduction

This document summarises the feedback gathered from the second round of engagement workshops conducted by Glasgow Airport Limited (GAL) to develop design principles for our new airspace change proposal (ACP 2019-46). Two workshops were conducted in the second round of engagement with aviation organisations, local government and business representatives and local community and interest groups. The workshops took place on October 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> 2019 at the Corinthian Club in Glasgow. A full list of the organisations that participated in the workshops is set out in Appendix A.

The objectives of the second round of engagement workshops were to:

- Increase the awareness and understanding among stakeholders about the need for airspace change and the process for bringing it about.
- Gain an understanding of what stakeholders believe are the main issues and opportunities connected with the use of airspace and any proposed changes.
- Review and further refine or discount the updated list of design principle statements created following the first round of engagement workshops and feedback.
- Establish a forum that can meet again in future stages of the airspace change process to compare and contrast potential airspace design options.

During the workshops, participants were given a presentation outlining the drivers for changing our airspace that are set out in the UK Airspace Modernisation Strategy (AMS) and an overview the regulatory process that all airspace change sponsors must follow.<sup>1</sup> Stakeholders were then presented with the initial list of potential design principles created from the first round of engagement (set out in Appendix B) and an explanation of the modifications made in response to the feedback provided by stakeholders (set out in Appendix C). Table 1 sets out the updated list of design principles that were considered by stakeholders in the second round of workshops.

The updated design principles were grouped into several themes for attendees to discuss in subgroups. For each theme the sub-groups were asked to consider:

- the need to add to or amend the updated design principle statements covered in the theme;
- Additional design principle statements that might be added and existing statements that should be consolidated or removed;
- Which, if any, principles in the theme should attract a relatively higher or lower priority in the context of the overall list of principles and why;
- General agreement with the updated principle statements and any specific objections.

The themes used to group design principles for consideration in the sub-groups are set out below with the relevant design principles in brackets:

- Safety (1)
- Capacity (2, 3, 4, 5)
- Noise (6, 7, 8, 9, 10)
- Airspace Access and Integration (11, 12, 13)
- Flight Efficiency/Environmental (14, 15)
- Other themes that are not adequately covered above (16, 17)

Section two of this document summarises the feedback gathered from the discussions about the updated design principles covered under each theme and proposes a refined list of design principle statements for final review with stakeholders prior to submission to the CAA. Section three explains how stakeholders can provide final feedback and comments on the refined design principles using the feedback form that accompanies this document.

# 2. Summary of feedback and refined design principles

Tables 1 to 6 summarise the feedback gathered from the discussions about the updated design principles covered in each theme and propose any relevant refinements. Similar points of feedback about are grouped together. A full list of the refined design principles created from the second round workshop feedback is set out in table 7.


