I am writing to you today in relation to the Airspace Change Proposal (ACP) titled "UAS BVLOS in Segregated Airspace (Oban-Isle of Mull-Coll) (ACP-2020-099)". Following on from the Assessment Meeting, you have conducted targeted stakeholder engagement and you have provided evidence of your engagement in a Summary Report. My colleagues and I have reviewed your ACP and associated documents today.

We felt the complex structure and managment processes developed potentially suggest a well formed proposal to address the your initial requirement. Unfortunately, on the basis of the evidence provided, we are not satisfied that the the requirements of the TDA process for the effective engagement has been met. It is evident that during the initial engagement, Skyports Ltd considered and responded to the feedback received from stakeholders, however inadequate (or insufficient) time was given to stakeholders to allow an appropriate consideration of the revised proposal. In addition, we cannot adequately assess the effect to key stakeholders in an area already impacted by Temporary Danger Areas. For this reason, the decision has been to **decline** the request for a Temporary Danger Area complex in relation to ACP-2020-099. At this stage if you would wish to proceed with this proposal, we feel it would be beneficial to conduct a further period of defined engagement. This should allow enough time to present the revised plan to all identified stakeholders in order to understand the final position from key stakeholders including Glenforsa airfield and those within the general aviation community.
