
MINUTES OF THE RAFAT ACP ASSESSMENT MEETING HELD AT AVIATION HOUSE ON 6 FEB 19

<u>CAA Assessment Meeting Opening Statement</u> The following mandatory statement was read:

The CAA has received the Statement of Need and presentation slides in advance of this Assessment Meeting and can confirm that the documents will be published together with the minutes of this meeting on the CAA Website. It must be noted that this is an Assessment Meeting and not a Gateway. The Change Sponsor will be required to provide a broad description of their proposed approach to meeting the CAA's CAP1616 requirements however the CAA will not at this stage decide whether the proposed approach meets the detailed requirements of the CAA's process.

The purpose of the Assessment Meeting as set out in detail in CAP 1616 is broadly for the Sponsor to present and discuss their Statement of Need, to enable the CAA to consider whether the proposal concerned falls within the scope of the formal airspace change process and to enable the CAA to consider the appropriate provisional Level to assign to the change proposal.

Additionally, the sponsor is required to provide information on how it intends to proceed to fulfil the requirements of the airspace change process and to provide information on timescales. Lastly, the sponsor is required to provide information on how it intends to meet the engagement requirements of the various stages of the airspace change process.

Item 1 – Introduction	
All attendees were introduced (see above). Apologies were made and the mandatory statement read.	

Item 2 – Statement of Need (discussion and review)			
The MOD introduced their Statement of Need as per the presentation, and discussed that:			
a. The MOD were open to discussion on the design, where possible.			
b. The MOD was expecting to progress the ACP as per the average timelines listed in the CAP1616.			
C. The importance of RAFAT both from a recruitment, reputational and defence engagement perspective, alongwith UK insdustrial strategy.			
d. The MOD were reducing the number of bases, as part of the Defence Estate Optimisation Programme, and RAF Scampton the home of RAFAT, was due to close in 2022.			
Item 3 – Issues or opportunities arising from proposed change			
The MOD discussed:			
a. Challenging project timeline, due the MOD hard deadline to vacate RAF Scampton by 2022. This means RAFAT need to be in place by autumn 2021. Timelines work at the moment, but it was highlighted that any delays in the ACP process could impact on the MOD Defence Estate Optimisation Programme.			
b. Demand on CAA and MOD personnel. It was recognised that the CAA has a high volume of ongoing ACPs. It was stated that the MOD intend on outsourcing the management of the RAFAT ACP, with an Invite to Tender date of 18 Feb 19.			
c. Multiple locations. The MOD have not yet announced RAFAT's new base. The MOD will shortly announce, 12 Feb 19, a list of potential air stations that will be examined in an Assessment Study (AS) and Investment Appraisal to ensure value for money. The AS is due to be complete by the end of 2019. This work will lead to the final decision on RAFAT's future home. It was discussed that until potential options are announced it will be difficult to progress the ACP and it would be necessary for engagement to occur at multiple locations.			
d. Release of current EGR313. The opportunity to release the existing EGR313.			
e. ACP design. It was explained that the ACP will need to be within reasonale proximity to the base. It was agreed that that basing options would be a constraint on the ACP.			
f. Airspace verticality. Airspace verticality was discussed. For training purposes the MOD would require the same airspace verticality across all potential sites.
