
Important Update on RPAS Flight Trials - ACP-2022-101

Dear Valued Stakeholder,

We are writing to provide you with the latest developments concerning the RPAS flight trials associated with ACP-2022-101. As you may already be aware, Project CAELUS2 has received approval from the UK Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) to establish a Temporary Segregated Area (TSA). Furthermore, the RPAS operator has secured the necessary Operational Authorisation, paving the way for the commencement of the trial flights.

Our operational parameters dictate a maximum of 3 flying days, with operational hours between 04:00 and 08:00 local time, contingent upon available slots in the commercial schedule. As such, we anticipate that most of our flights may conclude by 06:00 local time. We have scheduled these flights to take place between 31/10/2023 and 03/11/2023. However, recognising the unpredictability of weather conditions, we have designated backup flying days between 07/11/2023 and 10/11/2023. All relevant flight activities will be promulgated via NOTAM at least 24 hours in advance, inclusive of relevant contact information. Please note that NOTAMs will be cancelled if deemed unnecessary for particular days, but may still refer to the above range of dates.
